Abandoned fish farms clog the shores of Greece. An ocean conservation group is fighting back.

ENGAGE THE READER

Prepare for the lesson by finding images of two different packages of salmon from a grocery store: one labeled as farm-raised, the other labeled as wild. Have students analyze the images and identify the differences. Would they be more likely to buy one than the other? Why? Ask them to picture or sketch what they imagine a fish farm looks like. Show images of fish farms on Google. Is it what they imagined? Tell students they'll be learning about what happens to some abandoned fish farms today.

QUESTIONS FOR CLOSE READING AND DISCUSSION

- What is Healthy Seas? How is the group involved with ghost farms?
- Do you think Operation Ghost Farm is a worthwhile cause? Explain.
- What's the process of cleaning up an abandoned fish farm? What resources are necessary for a successful cleanup?

EXTEND LEARNING

After reading, have students return to the section "Making a Difference." Point out that Healthy Seas cares about ocean literacy. Have a class discussion about why ocean literacy is important. Explain that groups will work together to create a lesson for elementary students that will teach them something about the ocean and why it should be protected.

Group students and show the class the resources from Healthy Seas's website at healthysseas.org/knowledge/education-resources. Tell the groups they may use any of these resources, or they can do additional research to find other resources. You might provide groups with a lesson plan template to organize their lesson ideas and the resources that they'll use. When groups are done, find elementary classes in which students can conduct their lessons.
